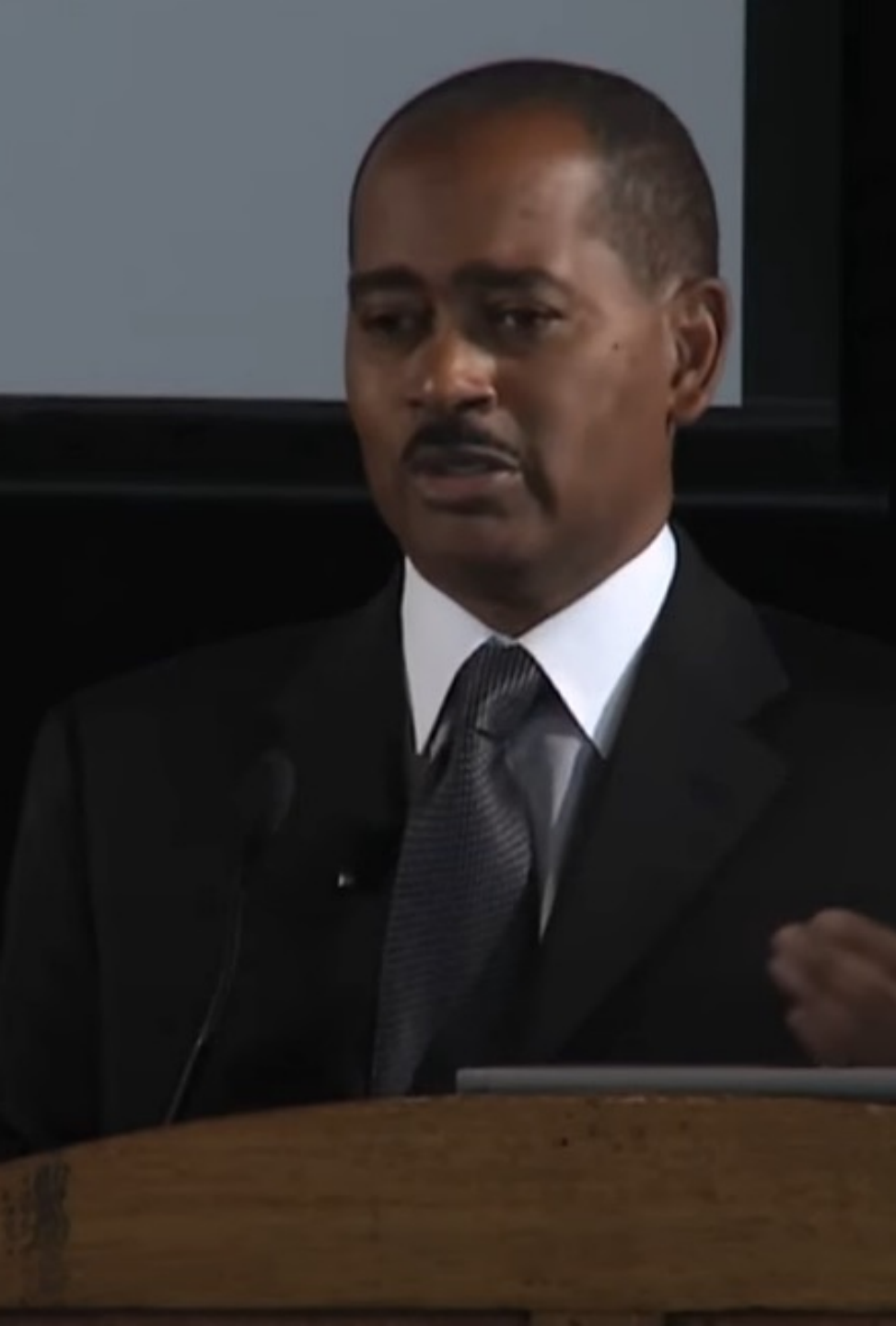

Vulnerability

“To teach vulnerably, one must first embody vulnerability. Educators should not impose their own world views upon their students or coerce them into adopting their worldviews, but rather acknowledge that their experiences outside the classroom invariably affect who they are inside the classroom” (Gatwiri & Ife, 2021, p.8).



Pedagogy of discomfort

*“What do we--educators and students--stand to gain by engaging in the discomfoting process of questioning cherished beliefs and assumptions?”
(Boler, 1999)*



**Build community
and create brave
and safer spaces.**

“Relationships are reciprocal between teacher and student and should foster connection to community and self” (Lake & Atkins, 2021, p.7)

- Get to know my students
- Initiate discussions (take the lead)
- Respond to questions or statements and address issues that arise (i.e., microaggressions)
- Join a community of practice in teaching and find a teaching support system



Incorporating EDIA in the course design & syllabus



- Tell them who you are and what is important in your teaching
- Course outcomes
- Readings
- Assignments
- Engage students through diverse activities
- Use language and images intentionally
- Remember everything communicates something
- Have a colleague read your syllabus
